

Knucklas village, close to the river Teme and the Shropshire border is two miles from the town of Knighton. Situated on the Heart of Wales railway line it is famous for a magnificent stone viaduct built in 1865. Knucklas Castle was built by the Mortimer family and completed in 1242. In 1402 it was attacked and destroyed by Owain Glyndwr's army. An earlier Iron Age fort may have existed on the same site and legend has it that King Arthur and Guinevere were married here! In 1955 three Bronze Age gold torcs and a 15th century sword were found at Cwm - Jenkin. These items can now be seen at the National Museum Cardiff. The parish church of St. David in Heyope was built in 1882, on the site of a medieval church; the font is 15th century. In 2010 Knucklas Castle Community Land Project took on the care of 21 acres of land including the castle mound. This land is now open to the public. A community orchard and allotment gardens can be found on the lower slopes and a pathway weaves through woodland to the site of the old castle. Here you can sit and enjoy spectacular views across Shropshire and Radnorshire.

Mae pentref Cnwclas ger Afon Tefeidiad a ffin Swydd Amwythig yn ddwy filltir o dref Tref-y-clawdd. Mae'r pentref ar lein reilffordd Calon Cymru ac mae'n enwog am y draphont gerrig godidog a adeiladwyd yn 1865. Adeiladwyd Castell Cnwclas gan deulu'r Mortimer a'i orffen yn 1242. Yn 1402 ymosodwyd arno a'i ddiinistrio gan fyddin Owen Glyndŵr. Mae'n bosibl yr oedd caer gynharach o'r Oes Haearn ar yr un safle ac yn ôl y chwedl, prododd Brenin Arthur a Gwenhwyfar yma! Yn 1955 darganfuwyd tri thorch aur o'r Oes Efydd a chleddyf o'r 15fed ganrif yng Nghwm-Jenkin. Erbyn hyn gallwch weld yr eitemau yn Amgueddfa Genedlaethol Caerdydd. Adeiladwyd Eglwys Blwyf Dewi Sant yn Heyope yn 1882 ar safle eglwys ganoloesol. Mae'r beddydfaen yn dyddio o'r 15fed ganrif. Yn 2010 fe wnaeth Prosiect Tir Cymunedol Castell Cnwclas gymryd gofal am 21 erw o dir, gan gynnwys tomen y castell. Erbyn hyn mae'r tir ar agor i'r cyhoedd. Fe welwch berllan gymunedol a gerddi lotmen ar y llethrau is, gyda llwybr yn gwneud trwy'r coed i safle'r hen gastell. Yma gallwch eistedd a mwynhau'r golygfeydd godidog ar draws Swydd Amwythig a Sir Faesyfed.
